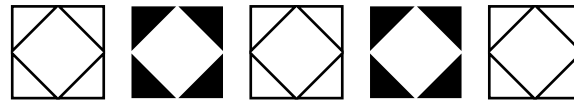


ENGLISH COUNTRY DANCING - A GENERAL OVERVIEW & PRIMER

- English Country is danced in long lines, usually.
- If you have ever seen square dance you have seen some of the types of moves used in English Country dance.
- Some of these dances date back to the 1700's, some are more recent.

- Dances are taught beforehand, then called out as they are danced to live music.
- For all ages, you do not need to bring a dance partner or have experience.

English Country Dance

- Northern Ohio -

The *Top* of the hall is toward the music.

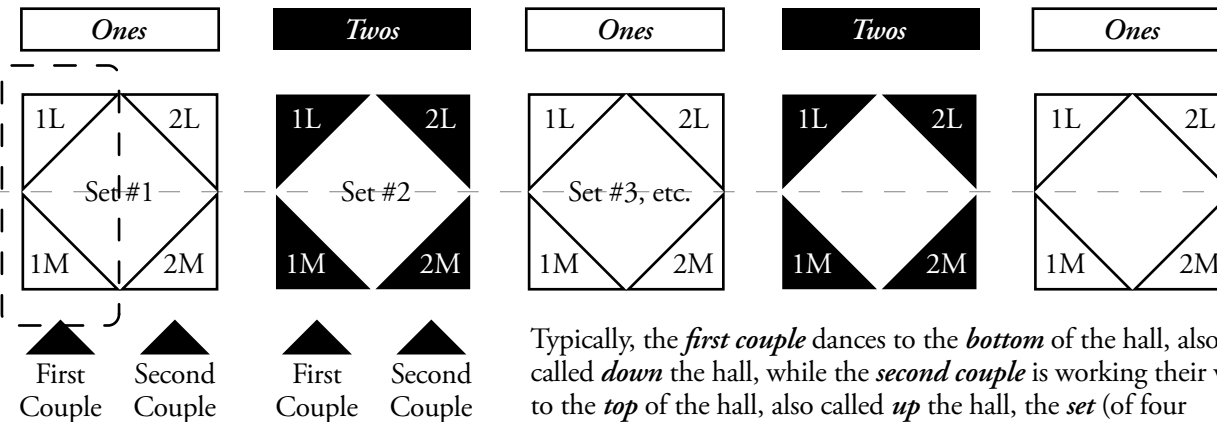


The *Caller* walks everyone through the dance, then calls it as danced.

1L = First Lady
 2L = Second Lady
 1M = First Man
 2M = Second Man

This sample lineup is very common but may vary by the dance.

The *Bottom* of the hall is away from the music.



Typically, the *first couple* dances to the *bottom* of the hall, also called *down* the hall, while the *second couple* is working their way to the *top* of the hall, also called *up* the hall, the *set* (of four couples) changing along the way.
